Administrator's Report 02/13/23



Four new Memorial Park Benches were installed over the past couple weeks in King Jack Park. The benches were sponsored by three local families who wished to commemorate their loved ones. They are all located near the walking trail and close to the lakes.

The city has purchased back the 5 acre parcel from the original developer who had failed to build as planned on the north side of the tracks east of East Street within the Centennial Retail District. The property is located between the Mattress Factory and Washe Laundromat.

Parks Department and Public Works are planning to begin work soon on the new parking lot to be located to the East of the Current soccer fields. Access to this parking area will be from Dawson Drive between Robert J. Baker and Hall Street.

Public Works Water Department will be conducting some vendor inquiries regarding the **planned revamp of the water well located at the main tower sight.** This tower has been out of service nearly since it was built due to what is believed to be a bent casing. We hope to be able to bring this well back on line in FY 22/23.

Cardinal Towers has been the recipient of several citizen complaints over the past many months. We have been working with local management to make improvements but are now reaching out to the owners of the property in hopes to quell some of the complaints. One of the complaints was that the smoke detection system was not functioning. The FD inspected the building and found no problem with the detection system and we have asked residents to contact us if they have issues within their private residences.

The contract and agreements were all finalized last week with MODOT and Anderson Engineering to begin the Traffic analysis plan on the streets for future needs. They will be focusing on the north side of 171 this year and we should have data available by the end of May that will aid in our FY22/23 paving schedule.

Waste Water crews are busy finishing the rebuild of the Walnut Ridge Lift Station. This station seems to be one that has seen the most abuse from the allegedly disposable wipes. We have tried to get the word out that these wipes could someday cause a sanitary sewer back up that we are trying to avoid.

The Parks Department will be working with the girls' softball association to make some needed improvements to the girls' fields. We currently are installing some new backstop braces that will make the areas much safer and hope to continue with new better padding.

Waste Water crews will be busy in the near future near the intersection of Broadway and Oronogo. Recent routine inspections have located what we believe to be a collapse in our main line in that area that will need their immediate attention. It is not causing any issues at this time but we hope to make repairs before it gets any worse.

The Fire Department reports that the area **Red Cross will be providing some smoke detectors** that they will be able distribute to those who may not have the means and also that the new **Emergency Management vehicle has been delivered** and will be having the new radio system installed soon.

Previous Meetings

The Parks Department has been busy preparing the new **pre-K** and **Kindergarten soccer field** that will be located where the old rodeo grounds were at. We have placed a small gravel parking lot alongside to hopefully relieve some of the walking for the little ones across the road and main parking area. We hope to begin work on the large parking lot to the east of the main fields this spring.

Park staff along with public works will be **removing the old road area on the north side of Paradise Lake** and adding it to the walking trail. That area has been barricade off since the construction of Dawson Drive.

Mayor Ragsdale along with city staff hosted the Webb City Chamber State of the City address at Granny Shaffer's last Tuesday. We would like to thank the council members who came out and the others from throughout the community. It was reported that our total construction was reported at \$28,600,437 which is in line with previous years. The only real slowdown noticed this past year was new housing starts in R-1. We had 27 new home permits issued last year where we have averaged 50-80 for the past many years. R-3 construction was up with the addition of the new Redwood Apartments complex to the south of Walmart. There was a significant increase in home remodel work with over \$9,000,000 in costs permits being issued.

Public Works hosted the Department Head plan review for the new R-3 project planned along North East Street, north of the new Ghetto Tacos, behind Kyle Hickam's new building. The plan was approved with some minor changes to Sanitary Sewer lines and other utilities. The project will extend Carson Way north to Aylor and include more than 40 housing units when complete.

2022 was not a good year regarding our Workers Compensation modification rating. City staff have met with our insurance carrier and it is anticipated we could see a 20% plus increase in our WC rates this year. Risk specialists from our carrier will be meeting in coming weeks with members of the City Employee Safety Committee to discuss any needs or policy changes needed that could help reduce employee related injuries.

Staff have placed the 3% increase in retail sales tax for marijuana ballot question on the upcoming council agenda. This would only apply to recreational sales of the product should a dispensary be built within the city and only after a majority of voters approve it in the April Ballot. Has no effect if the Council should decide to put the ban on the 2024 Presidential election as the amendment requires.

The idea of placing a **sunshade of some type over the Amphitheater** is still being discussed. We have some ideas that would include a vinyl material covering that would be retractable when not in use. This would significantly extend the life of the material. We hope to have something to present to council in the next month for their consideration.

Staff were notified that MODOT has approved our application for sidewalk improvements along the east side of East Street from MO171 to Daugherty and some along Daugherty. This grant will fund 75% of the design and construction costs as was approved by council. More details will be coming forward soon on contracts and costs as we move forward with this grant and also the Governors Cost share grant application for widening of East street and a new roundabout at Daugherty. We should be receiving word on that project soon. As reported earlier currently the budget includes two major projects which council can approve the use of the American Recovery Plan funds for. One is the retention project along MO 171 and the other would be the East Street widening and roundabout improvement plan. Currently we have applied for grant funding that would assist at 50% of the cost for East Street and 80% of the sidewalk improvement plan.

Our engineer reports that **geotechnical field work was completed on 11/1/2022 in reference to the proposed storm water retention project** along Mo 171 at Powell Drive. Lab testing begins 11/2/2022. Rain delayed start of Geotech field work, but will not impact overall project schedule. Survey set to begin in mid-November. (update, field work complete and design work begins Jan 9th)

City staff have been busy working on a new web site. The current site has had some issues and made it very difficult to make changes. We are wanting to incorporate some additional features such as online bill pay and permit applications. It will still be located at the same domain of www.webbcitymo.org and we hope to announce the unveiling very soon.

- (1) S & H Farm Supply \$32,898.40 (This is for (2) mowers only)
- (2) John Deere \$36,800.00
- (3) Kubota \$37,000.00

RECOMMENDATION

:

Staff recommends that council approves the purchase of \$37,000 from Kubota. While Kubota is not the cheapest of the (3) options they are the only available machines within the next few months. We have also been using Kubota mowers for the past 10 years or so and believe it to be the better machine. Kubota also offers a great loaner plan to keeps the Parks staff up and running and most importantly on schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds for this purchase are included in the budget. When combined, funds for 2 mowers budgeted at \$30,000 and Field Pro budgeted at \$7,000 will cover the cost of 3 new mowers. The Field Pro will not be purchased this year.




