## Administrator's Report 06/10/24

Our **new well, #15, located at the water tower on Tracy Street has been acting up.** We have determined that there is some type of surge causing the large fuse system to shut the well down. Staff have been working with Liberty Electric to try and determine where the issue is at and how to fix it. We have been forced to open the MOAM valve a couple times due to this issue.

Parks Department reports that **Baseball and Softball are in full swing** now and we are certainly doing our best to keep the fields playable as this has been a rather wet start to the season. We have been able to play several evenings when all area fields have closed due to the weather. This is a direct result of the effort put forth by our staff to make sure we do all we can to let the kids play.

Public Works staff have been **busy prepping areas that are anticipated to be paved** once council approves the proposed paving plan that has been submitted in this council meeting agenda. Areas that are in need of attention are seeing or are going to be seeing some mill work and cuts along with gravel to be ready when the pavers arrive. Waste Water crews are also busy prepping these locations and getting ready to place manhole rings when the paving occurs.

Waste Water crews have been busy with our Vactor truck recently **going after areas that have roots within our main sewer lines.** Our work in this area we believe has reduced our reported overflows this year even with the large amounts of rain we have had. We will continue to work to reduce the obstructions within our system.

**The Fire Department has been working on testing hydrants** around town in case you see a hydrant flowing that appears to have been left open. Still report it to us if you see that but that is most likely what it is. 😊

The **children's meal tent at Farmers Market has been repaired** and replaced after having been destroyed in a recent storm.

The filming of the documentary about the composting and waste water project is continuing. **Crews have been given tours by Habitat and Plant staff for the last couple weeks. The grinding is continuing on the large amount of limbs** as a result of the recent storms. We were forced to spend \$20,000 on a repair to the machine in order to keep it online. Recently the mulch that is being produced has been used in several of our parks thus reducing costs. Specifically it has been used to soften the playground surfaces and thus far has worked out really well.

## **CruisaPaloosa planning is in full swing. It starts July13th!**

### **Previous Meetings**

**With the last days of school coming and some good weather days, King Jack Park has seen a large number of visitors.** It has been nice to watch the hundreds of school children being given tours by Erin Turner and other members of the Parks Department. They then all received a ride on the Trolley around the park from the Southwest Railroad Association Volunteers. There was even a video shoot conducted with the dancers Ovation Dance Studio in Carthage.

In-between all the good weather we have had there have been some not so good weather events. **Thursday afternoon, May 2<sup>nd</sup>** the area received that a sudden storm had developed in the Carl Junction area and was possibly headed towards Webb City. Our dispatch personnel were notified and had the sirens up and running almost immediately. We are lucky the path was more north than our city but the quick thinking of all involved was appreciated as there was no warning of severe weather as there normally is. Police Chief relayed a Job well done by all!

Then on **Monday May 16<sup>th</sup>** we had another round of severe weather come through and we did have notice of the approaching weather. The storm shelters were opened at 10:30pm about an hour before the sirens were activated and then the storms came through our area. The City of Webb City was fortunate that it basically passed over us and we had minimal damage.

Then again on **Wednesday May 8<sup>th</sup>** we experienced another round of possible severe weather in our area. Our Emergency Management team was watching the situation closely and since the storm was never predicted to be towards Webb City we did not activate our sirens as did Joplin and Carthage who both received damage from the storm.

The response to the recently mailed **lead pipe survey** has been very supportive of our efforts to assist DNR in determining the extent of lead pipes in our area. We have received several hundred responses back to date and we have had only one that is reported to have lead pipe in a service line. We are in the process of confirming that at this time.

**The annual City Wide Cleanup** has been ongoing this week. Only issue thus far has been there were some recent changes to the schedule due to our growth that GFI had to add Fridays as a pickup day and changed some of the east side of towns days to be picked up. We have had several calls and advised those effected that we would get back to their areas and clean up what was missed. **The Hazardous Waste and Electronics cleanup will be held this Saturday May 11<sup>th</sup>** at the Public Works facility located at 160 N. Madison this weekend.

**City staff would like to say thank you to the Ministerial Alliance** for hosting a very nice, well attended, Mayor's Prayer Breakfast last week at the First Baptist Church. It was nice to see so many city staff and council in attendance.

City Hall staff have been busy stuffing over 4500 envelopes for **the lead pipe survey to be mailed out to all residents from the City of Webb City.** There will be instructions on how to provide information and return. This is a voluntary program and will be no cost to the homeowner. We do not believe there will be very many homes in Webb City with lead pipes but we have been directed by the DNR to conduct this survey. The envelopes will look a little strange but these are outdated and been sitting in storage for years. Better than buying all new..

**A couple of new stop signs have been placed at the corner of Walker and Daugherty.** This was done at the request of Cardinal Scales due to the danger involved when trucks have to back into their docks north of Walker. Digital signs have been in place for awhile now to warn of the coming sign change. Cardinal Scale built the frame for the west bound lane to attach to their building that prevented the damaging of the sidewalk.

**City wide Garage Sale May 3-5<sup>th</sup>** and the next week **May 6-10<sup>th</sup>** will be the **City Wide Spring Clean Up.** Just as last few years this will be a curbside pickup on your regularly scheduled trash pickup day.

City staff continue to work with the Dawson Heritage Foundation regarding site plans for the **future Webb City Recreation Facility** to be located in King Jack Park. We are working on plans for fill to bring the building to curb level, parking lot arrangements and bringing in the utilities. Pictured are the potholes dug at the site and so far we have found nothing that worries us.

Recent announcements for improvements and funding regarding planned expansions at Fidelity and Interstate 44 have drawn the attention of City Staff. **We believe it to be of utmost importance that Interstate 49 be routed off of Interstate 44 and moved to MO249 and MO 171** which we have always been told were already built to interstate standards for that purpose. The recent increase in accidents demonstrate that running both interstate systems in the same location is dangerous and this was intended to be a temporary fix until the Carthage 171 and 49 interchange could be improved to interstate standards. If this planned expansion goes through the city of Webb City, the eastern side of Joplin, Carterville and all the distance from Carthage to Webb City may never see the advantages of having an Interstate Highway. And in addition to the loss of any future economic impacts the unsafe conditions will just continue along Interstate 44.

**The Caboose** has been being reconstructed by the Webb City High School Vo-Tech Department. We were recently advised it is near completion and the Parks Department is now working to build a pad in front of the Depot and Farmers Market Kitchen for display. It is our hope this location will prevent some of the vandalism that was occurring back by the splash-Pad.



190 hours of department training and 10 hours of Public Relations have been conducted and we continue to assist the other departments in the city as needed.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PARAGRAPH A, SUBSECTION 15, OF SECTION 405.500 OF THE WEBB CITY CODE REGARDING SPECIAL USES AND USES UPON REVIEW.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBB CITY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Subsection 15 of Paragraph A of Section 405.500 of the Webb City Code shall be repealed and a new Subsection 15 of Paragraph A of Section 405.500 shall be adopted in its place as follows:

A.

**15.** Temporary use of land for commercial or industrial purposes, provided that any building or structure constructed thereon must be otherwise permitted in the district in which such land is situated, and any stored equipment or material shall be removed upon the date of expiration or revocation of the special use permit. Any such permit shall be valid for not more than two (2) years, but may be renewable by submitting an application for renewal to the City prior to the expiration of the current special use permit. The City Administrator or his/her designee shall review the renewal application for approval or denial. Renewal applicants must be in compliance with the conditions or restrictions imposed in the original special use permit, and all permits are subject to revocation by the City.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage.


